**T**he development of US Lacrosse policy and priorities is determined by the leadership of hundreds of volunteers from all over the country who contribute their time and expertise to US Lacrosse as members of the Board of Directors, Division Leadership, Councils and Committees. # FOUNDATION

**T**he US Lacrosse Foundation is an independent nonprofit corporation that operates in support of US Lacrosse. The principal aims and objectives of the Foundation are to encourage, foster and promote the sport of lacrosse, as played by both men and women, in the United States and, in particular, to benefit and support the programs and activities of US Lacrosse.

In 2005 the Foundation continued its work on behalf of US Lacrosse and the sport:

- Hosted the 5th annual USLF Putting Tournament. The event, at Bethpage Black in Farmingdale, N.Y. , raised more than \$50,000 in funds for US Lacrosse. Since the inception of the event in 2001, more than \$320,000 has been raised.
- Led the effort to attract more high-level donors to the organization. A record 196 families and organizations were part of the First Sport Society for donating more than \$1,000 annually.
- Continued its support towards the partnership between US Lacrosse and 361 Sports and Event Marketing. The relationship is paving the way to provide critical corporate support.

# CHAPTERS

One of the critical factors to the success of US Lacrosse is our regional network of chapters. The chapters provide the framework to help the sport grow at the grassroots level and harness the energy provided by the sport's most dedicated volunteers.

In 2005, US Lacrosse welcomed two more chapters to the fold – Hawaii and Orange County (Calif.). There are now 54 chapters nationwide working the support the US Lacrosse mission.

US Lacrosse continued to provide financial resources to help support the chapters. In 2005, US Lacrosse returned \$189,532 to local chapters as part of its chapter rebate program. The program returns a portion of each member's annual dues to their local chapter.

2005 also marked the implementation of a chapter grant program. US Lacrosse awarded a total of \$20,000 to 10 chapters to help fund chapter initiatives that ranged from education programs for coaches and officials to financial assistant to needy teams to promotional packages to help generate interest in starting new programs.
