The Olympic Club

In 1922, the Lakeside Clubhouse of the Olympic Club was erected overlooking the Pacific Ocean between San Francisco and Daly City, about ten miles south of the famed downtown facility. Three golf courses were planned in the surrounding area, the Lake, Ocean, and Cliffs courses. This 36-hole layout has been regarded as the one of the most picturesque and demanding layouts in the United States. In addition to hosting such golf events at the US Amateur and US Junior Amateur Championships, the Lake Course has been the site for the several exciting US Opens.

With breathtaking views of the Golden Gate Bridge, Golden Gate Park, and the Pacific Ocean, the course is currently in the best shape of the past 25 years. The United States Golf Association recognizes the Olympic Club as one of the first 100 golf clubs in the country. In addition, GOLFWEEK Magazine named Olympic Club one of "America's 100 Best Classical Courses".

Guest Speaker

Richie Moran served as the head coach of the Cornell Lacrosse Team for 29 years and is known throughout our community, our country and the world, for his prowess in the sports world. He has held many positions and received numerous recognitions and awards for his accomplishments in the world of lacrosse.

As a lacrosse coach, Richie led Cornell Lacrosse to 3 National Championships; holds the NCAA Division I record of 42 consecutive wins at Cornell; was the US National Lacrosse Head Coach in the 1978 World Games; the Irish National Lacrosse Head Coach in the 2002 World Games; and the 1973 Head Coach of the North in the North/South All Star Game.

He is a member of no less than 6 Halls of Fame, including the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame, where he was inducted in 1983.

Richie currently serves as the President of the Irish Lacrosse Foundation and Executive Director of the US Lacrosse Coaches Association. He is a recipient of the 2005 Peter Kohn Award and he and his lovely wife Pat are loyal members of the US Lacrosse First Sport Society.

As a volunteer, he is President of the Board of the Franziska Racker Centers. He is a member of the Boards for the American Cancer Society, Tompkins County Learning Partners, Gadabout, Save the Day (benefiting the Dream Factory), Rear Commodore Ithaca Yacht Club and last, but not least, organized his players and participated for many years as a Volunteer Bell Ringer for The Salvation Army in Ithaca, New York. As you can see, Richie wears many hats, all of which has one word on them... "success!"

Did You Know in 2005...

- Players on 80 teams, from 27 states, all demonstrating financial need, were the beneficiaries of a US Lacrosse Youth Equipment Grant. Grants include a full team's worth of equipment and are awarded to programs in their first year of operations. This year's grant packages had a total retail value of more than \$400,000.
- Three new youth lacrosse programs were welcomed to the US Lacrosse BRIDGE Initiative, now totaling 16 affiliates in 12 states, all of which introduce at-risk inner city children to the sport and give them access to teams, equipment, quality coaching, and valuable life skills.
- In response to the need for greater educational resources we launched numerous programs and initiatives, highlighted by the US Lacrosse Coaches Education Program, the first ever nationally standardized coaching curriculum in the sport's history. Nearly 2,000 coaches have successfully completed the Level 1 On-Line Course, and over 750 coaches have participated in Level 1 Instructional Clinics – delivered by US Lacrosse to their home state – where the online course is brought to life through hands-on experiences and personal instruction from highly qualified trainers.
- US Lacrosse has recently unveiled a cleaner, user-based Web site, which you can find at www.uslacrosse.org. Last year the site had more than 6.8 million page views, and continues to provide critical information about the sport to members and the general public.
- A US Lacrosse-funded study on lacrosse injuries in high school-aged boys and girls was published in the September issue of American Journal of Sports Medicine. Members of the US Lacrosse Sports and Science Safety Committee spearheaded the study.
- With an eye always on the future, our national leadership has recently begun the development of its second US Lacrosse Strategic Plan and will present its recommendations for new organizational priorities to the Board of Directors in January of 2007.

US Lacrosse

US Lacrosse was founded in 1998 as the national governing body of men's and women's lacrosse. The mission of US Lacrosse is to ensure a unified and responsive organization that develops and promotes the sport by providing services to its members and programs to inspire participation, while preserving the integrity of the game. We envision a future that offers people everywhere the opportunity to discover, learn, participate in, enjoy and ultimately embrace the shared passion of the lacrosse experience.

The US Lacrosse Foundation

The US Lacrosse Foundation is an independent non-profit corporation that operates in support of US Lacrosse. The principal aims and objectives of the Foundation are to encourage, foster and promote the sport of lacrosse, as played by both men and women, in the United States and, in particular, to benefit and support the programs and activities of US Lacrosse. The US Lacrosse Foundation accomplishes this mission by leading efforts in the areas of major gifts fundraising, sponsorship programs, as well as the management, growth and performance of the US Lacrosse Foundation endowment and other assets.
