2003 Under-19 World Championships
CODE OF CONDUCT

On behalf of the International Federation of Women's Lacrosse Associations, I confirm my responsibility for the safety and well being of myself as a member of the official party of the (country) Under-19 Team while participating in the 2003 Under-19 World Lacrosse Championships. Further I agreed to abide by the provisions and spirit of the following Code of Conduct under penalty of disqualification.

ALCOHOL:

At no time during the tour may alcohol be consumed by players. Please note that it is illegal for anyone under age 21 to consume alcohol in the State of Maryland. Violators are subject to immediate arrest. Additionally, no alcohol may be consumed by those of legal drinking age in the event venue, dorms or anywhere on the campus of Towson University. A failure to adhere to this requirement will result in expulsion from the competition and event housing.

SMOKING:

Smoking is a known health hazard. It is detrimental to the performance of elite athletes and is strongly discouraged. Members of the official team party are asked not to smoke while wearing any form of their official uniform or at any official event functions. Towson University prohibits smoking in the dormitories and Regional Sports Complex at all times.

DORMITORIES:

The 2003 Under-19 World Championships will, for the first time, include both men's and women's play in one event. Men's and women's teams will be housed in separate dorm accommodations throughout the event. At no time are members of a men's team allowed to be in the women's dorm, and at no time are members of the women's team allowed to be in the men's dorm. A failure to adhere to this requirement will result in expulsion from the competition and event housing.

GENERAL BEHAVIOR:

The International Federation of Women's Lacrosse Associations, as the governing body for these respective championships, reserves the right to sanction team members who do not conduct themselves honorably. As referenced above, sanctioning includes, but is not limited to, disqualification of players from competition.
